Haralambos Ventis was born in Athens in 1967. He studied Philosophy and Theology and holds doctoral degrees from Boston University and the Catholic University of Leuven. His doctoral research focused on the impact of the linguistic turn in twentieth-century philosophy on theological discourse, as well as on Political Philosophy and Ethics, respectively.

His academic interests include Kantian philosophy, the Philosophy of Language, Postmodernism, contemporary Political Theory and Ethics — with particular attention to the Political liberalism of John Rawls — and the Philosophy of Religion.

He translated into English Christos Yannaras's *Heidegger and the Areopagite: On the Absence and Unknowability of God*, published in the United Kingdom by T&T Clark in 2005.

He is the author of four books: *Essays in Philosophy of Religion* (Ekkremes Publications, 2025), *Liberal Democracy and Christian Faith* (Armos Publications, 2023), *Eschatology and Otherness* (Polis Publications, 2019), and *The Reductive Veil: Post-Kantian Non-Representationalism Versus Apophatic Realism* (Epektasi Publications, 2005; in English).

His papers and essays have appeared in the journals *Anthropos*, *Deukalion*, *Theologia*, *Synaxi*, *The Books' Journal*, *CONTACTS*, and *Le Messenger Orthodoxe*, as well as in numerous edited volumes published in Greek, English, and French.
